The Learning Commons is full of open, flexible spaces that can be adapted to fit a wide variety of needs. Here you can find knowledgeable staff who can help you transform your ideas into reality.

STEP 1



**Encounter

New**

Discover knowledge and inspiration through a variety of new encounters with people, technology, information, and other things. First, visit the Learning Commons and take a look around.

STEP 2



**Talk with
Others**

Putting your thoughts into words and getting feedback from others is vital to developing any idea. Even a casual conversation among friends can reveal different opinions and perspectives that can spark new connections.

STEP 3



**Get
Organized**

Considering different perspectives and gaining an objective view of your idea is key to transforming it into a compelling project. Ask staff members for advice and keep the conversation going as you organize your thoughts into a plan.

STEP 4



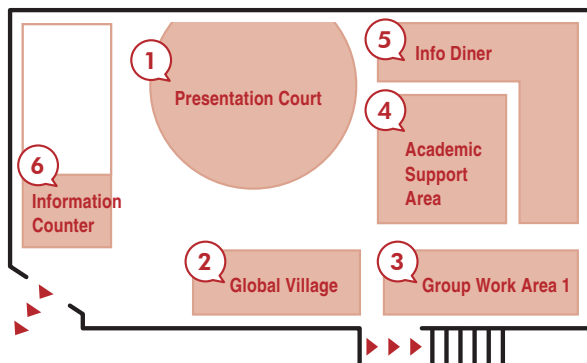
**Take

The Presentation Court represents the core design concept of the Learning Commons. This open, flexible event space can easily be configured to suit a wide variety of events that engage not only participants but also catch the interest of those passing by. For example, seating can be arranged for a lecture, or the grid of ceiling mounted tracks can be used to display posters for a poster session or exhibit.

Info Diner

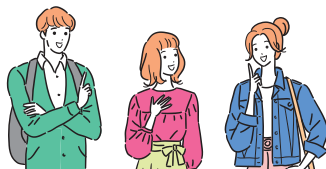


(16 Booths (6 people each booth))

Information Counter

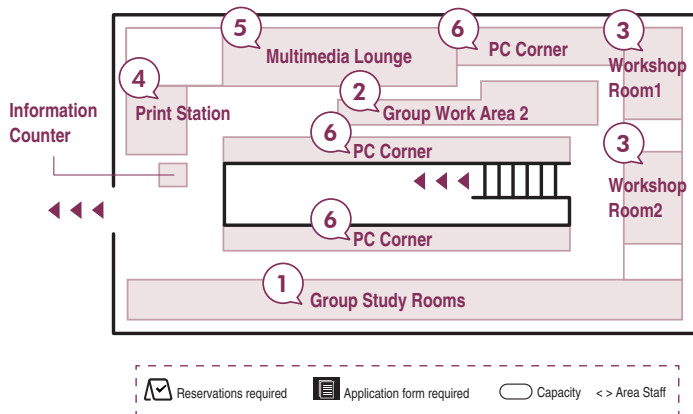
<Information Counter Staff, Learning Support Coordinators>

1 Group Study Rooms

7 Rooms (approx. 14 people each room)



Use one room when meeting in a small group or combine rooms to accommodate more people by moving the string curtains. Equipped with whiteboards and electronic blackboards, these rooms are great for staying focused when collaborating as a group.



2 Group Work Area 2

3 Workshop Rooms

2 Rooms (1 approx. 25 people 2 approx. 30 people)

※ Open to students as a study space when not reserved for other purposes.



Move and combine the tables to suit your group's needs. Brainstorm in a large group, break into smaller groups for different tasks, or make space to spread out large sheets of paper.



For your next workshop, consider Room 1, a closed space with clear glass walls, or Room 2, an open space with lots of natural light. These rooms are also regularly used to hold workshops on various academic skills.

4 Print Station <Print Station Staff>



A one-stop shop for all your printing needs. You can print large posters, flyers, and name cards, or create laminated items, bound booklets, custom t-shirts, and novelty goods. Need some design advice? The Print Station Staff is here to help!

5 Multimedia Lounge <Multimedia Lounge Staff>



Acquire new technical skills as you edit and process images and videos using a full suite of programs, and create 3D models with a 3D printer. The staff is always ready to help, so don't hesitate to ask questions.

6 Open computer lab (PC Corner)



Desktop PCs are available for working on reports and viewing references and databases.

There are on-demand printers (DoKoDeMo Printer) in the Learning Commons, and printouts are available.

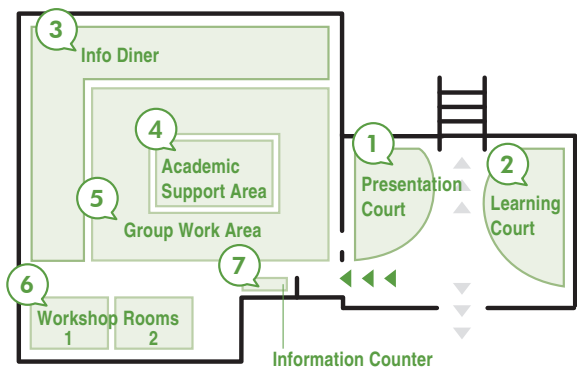

1 Presentation Court

approx. 40 people

- ※Up to approximately 70 people when using seats only.
- ※Open to students as a study space when not reserved for other purposes.



Located to the left of the library entrance, the Presentation Court is an adaptable space where events can engage not only participants but also can catch the interest of those passing by. Use the ceiling mounted tracks to display posters for a poster session or exhibit or rearrange seating and use the wide screen for a lecture or presentation.

2 Learning Court



This study space is located on the right side of the main entrance of the library. There are both table and counter seating, and the space can be used for a wide range of purposes from individual study to small group study.



3 Info Diner

 17 Booths (4-6 people each booth)

※Same-day reservation available



With booth seats, whiteboards, display screens (some with electronic blackboard functionality), and adjustable tables, the relaxed setting of the Info Diner is great for group work. Collaborate efficiently by writing out ideas on the whiteboard or sharing content from your computer on a display screen.

4 Academic Support Area

<Faculty, Academic Instructors, LA>



Faculty, Academic Instructors, and Learning Assistants (LA) are ready to answer your questions and guide you through report writing, research, mathematics, programming, specialized coursework for different majors, and more. Get advice from an expert! Whether on your own or in a group, feel free to come here for help.

5 Group Work Area



Move and combine the tables to suit your group's needs. Brainstorm in a large group, break into smaller groups for different tasks, or make space to spread out large sheets of paper.

You can also hold small seminars for up to a dozen people or use the projectors and ceiling mounted tracks to hold a poster session.

Rearrange the Layout of the tatami-covered benches for different purposes.

6 Workshop Rooms

 2 Rooms (approx. 8 people each room)

※Up to approximately 18 people when the two rooms are used as one large room
※Open to students as a study space when not reserved for other purposes.



The clear glass walls create an open atmosphere for workshops and study sessions. Remove the partition wall to combine the rooms for a larger space.
